## Achievements and Challenges of the NRA



- 1. Development of new regulatory requirements for NPP and nuclear cycle facilities enacted 8 July 2013 and 18 December respectively, based on lessons learnt from the Fukushima Dai-ichi Accident.
- 2. Review of existing nuclear facilities based on new regulatory requirements, currently for 17 NPPs and 8 nuclear fuel cycle facilities.
- 3. Supervision of clean-up activities for the Fukushima Dai-ichi NPP, where we face new and unprecedented difficulties.
- 4. Development of new guidelines for Emergency Preparedness and Response in Radiological Emergency, following the more than 1000 evacuation-related deaths due to the Fukushima Dai-ichi Accident.
- 5. Proposal of practical measures for displaced residents to return their hometowns and resume their old lifestyles.
